## PARADISE CORNER



Ted Widmer is an expert on the speeches of Abraham Lincoln. He describes Thanksgiving as "our most unifying holiday." He says this is because, "In general, the holiday is celebrated the same way around the country.... There are no blue-state versions and red-state versions. We all experience roughly the same routine as we go in and out of the annual food coma, punctuated by sidelong glimpses at football games and floating Snoopys on TV...relatives and stragglers, breaking bread together."

He goes on to write about how—while the idea of a national day of Thanksgiving goes as far back as the presidency of George Washington

who declared such a day in 1789—it took another seventy-five years for it to catch on permanently. 1863 was the year a writer named Sarah Josepha Hale persuaded President Abraham Lincoln that a consistent Thanksgiving holiday was needed because she believed it could help heal the nation—which—at that time—was divided by the Civil War.

Widmer suggests we can still learn from the idea of gathering—even with those with whom we disagree—to think of the debt of gratitude we owe the Wampanoag Indians who were living in what is now the United States when the Mayflower and her passengers arrived and who helped those early settlers survive in a new land. Because of the Wampanoag Indians—and the second chance they gave the Pilgrims—we live in a country where we have much to celebrate not just at Thanksgiving—but throughout the year. This includes the location of our own beautiful "church on the hill."

Millcreek Lutheran Church is located on the original and ancestral homelands of the Lenni-Lenape and Susquehannock peoples, and we give thanks for their presence here since time immemorial. We also wish to recognize and honor all our indigenous siblings who have and continue to call this land home. This is especially true at Thanksgiving which—as Ted Widmer reminds us—is our country's most unifying holiday.

I believe that all becomes a reminder of how God draws us closer both to one another but to all those before and after us so that we can unite in seeing the way God works through us for the sake of the world. Like the Wampanoag Indians—and the second chance they gave the Pilgrims—God continues to bless us with new opportunities to spread God's own holy and lifegiving love both when we gather and when we are apart. In Christ, God draws us all together, and, for that, we are indeed thankful.
