PARADISE CORNER

I am a person who gets bogged down in details far too easily. Sometimes I manage to fit those details into the larger picture in an appropriate way. Sometimes I fail to fit those details into the larger picture in an appropriate way. The bottom line is that, whether I succeed or fail at fitting the details into the larger picture in an appropriate way, managing the details is a skill I work on continually.

This is one of the reasons I am grateful to be part of a religious tradition that keeps a liturgical calendar. It is easy for me, as someone who preaches every Sunday, to get bogged down in the details of the Scripture readings that come our way. What our liturgical calendar gives me is a way to fit the details into the larger picture. In fact, part of the research I was doing in preparation for preaching during the seven Sundays of Easter helped me to do that. (Our liturgical tradition keeps Easter not for one day, or even for a week, but for seven weeks, or “a week of weeks.”)

My research revealed that an overarching theme of the Easter season is one of belonging. Throughout the season, the Scriptures remind us about our place in God’s family. The author of an unsigned article I came across regarding our Scripture readings for the Easter season suggests Russian nesting dolls as a helpful illustration. Jesus is within God, and we are in turn within Jesus. Just like those smaller dolls nest inside the larger dolls, God embraces and protects us. We are not just with Jesus but also within Jesus. We are as much a part of Jesus as he is of God. The same author concludes, “The security that knowledge brings can be a springboard for action in the world.”

Actions to help others belong are an important part of showing we have a community where everyone belongs. We help others belong because we ourselves belong. I am always grateful our church family does a great job in helping as many people as possible belong. We

usually welcome visitors warmly. We celebrate and support our children. We value our older members for their wisdom. And, during the month of April, which is Autism Acceptance Month, we will celebrate each individual's unique differences that help us to experience the inclusivity and connectedness God intends especially for the most vulnerable among us.

I believe that one of the most faithful things we can do this Easter season is keep the inclusivity and connectedness God intends for us and the world within our field of vision. Details matter, but without the larger picture, the details draw attention to themselves. For this reason, I invite us to use these days of Easter to remember that because we all belong to God we all belong to each other as well. God assures us of that in the resurrection of Christ, which we celebrate in a special way throughout the Easter Season through which God brings all of the details together in one glorious picture of life in Christ—connected to God and connected to one another.
